

MEDICAL REPORT REQUIREMENT FOR DAY CARE CHILDREN

The Licensing Standards require a completed medical report on all day care children when they are entering day care and every 2 years thereafter.

Child medical reports (form 600) are the same form that is used by the Illinois Public School System. In order for your daycare provider to be in compliance with the Day Care Home Standards, the following is required:

1. The medical report must be completely filled out and signed by your child's physician showing that your child is healthy and has had a current and complete medical examination.
2. The medical report shall indicate that your child has been immunized, including HIB and is up to date with their immunizations.
3. A TB best (mantoux) result and date in the initial examination for all children who have attained 1 year of age or at the age of 1 for children who are enrolled in daycare prior to their first birthday.
4. The initial examination shall show that children 6 months through 6 years of age have been screened for lead poisoning for children residing in an area defined as high risk by the Illinois Department of Public Health in its Lead Poisoning Prevention Code.
